ORDINANCE NO. 1033

AN ORDINANCE ESTABLISHING A CURFEW TIME OF 12:00 O'CLOCK, P. M., FOR CHILDREN BETWEEN THE AGES OF SIXTEEN (16) AND EIGHTEEN (18) YEARS; DEFINING THE DUTIES OF PARENTS OR OTHER LEGAL CUSTODIANS OF SUCH CHILDREN; AND PROVIDING A PENALTY FOR THE VIOLATION THEREOF.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT ORDAINED AND ENACTED by the Council of the Borough of Donora, washington County, Pennsylvania, and it is hereby ordained and enacted by the authority of the same as follows:

SECTION 1. That no child between the ages of sixteen (16) and eighteen (18) years shall be in or upon any of the public streets, highways, alleys, parks or other public places of the Borough of Donora unless such child is accompanied by his or her parent, guardian or other person having the legal care or custody of such child, or is accompanied by a responsible person of good repute over twenty-one years of age, or is in the performance of an errand or duty directed by his or her parent, guardian or legal custodian, or, whose legal recognized employment makes it necessary for such child to be in or upon said public streets, highways, alleys, parks or other public places after the hour of Twelve (12:00 P. M.) o'clock, the said Curfew time and 7:00 A. M., of the following day, in which case each child shall carry a certified card of employment signed by the Mayor.

SECTION 2. No parent, guardian or other person having the legal care of custody of a child between the ages of sixteen (16) and eighteen (18) years shall allow or permit any such child to go or be in or upon any of the public streets, highways, alleys, parks, or other public places of the Borough of Donora, after the said Curfew Time, and between said Curfew Time and 7:00 A. M. of

the following day, except as specified in Section 1 of this Ordinance, or unless reasonable necessity can be shown therefor.

SECTION 3. The policemen of the Borough of Donora, upon finding a child between the ages of sixteen (16) and eighteen (18) years in or upon any of the public streets, highways, alleys, parks or other public places of the Borough of Donors in violation of any of the provisions of this Ordinance after the said Ourfew Time, and between the said Curfew Time and 7:00 A. M., of the following day, shall take the name of such child and the name and address of the parent, guardian or other person having the legal care or custody of such child, send such child home, and make report of the same to the Chief of Police within twenty-four (24) hours whereupon the Chief of Police shall send to the said perent, guardian or other legal custodian of such child a written notice of the violation of this Ordinance, together with notice to such parent, guardian or logal custodian that unless the terms of this Ordinance are complied with the penalty thereof will be invoked against such parent, guardian or legal custodian of such child.

SECTION 4. Any parent, guardian or legal custodian of a child between the ages of sixteen (16) and eighteen (18) years violating any of the provisions of this Ordinance, after notice thereof, as provided in Section 3, shall, upon conviction thereof before the Mayor or any Justice of the Peace of the Borough of Donora, be sentenced to pay a fine of not less than Ten (\$10.00) Dollars or more than One Hundred (\$100.00) Dollars, and coets of prosecution, and in default of the payment of said fine and costs of prosecution, shall be imprisoned in the jail of Washington County for a period not exceeding ten (10) days.

SECTION 5. This Ordinance supplements and does not ropeal

Ordinance 811 establishing a Curfew Time of 10:00 o'clock, P. M., for children under the age of sixteen (16) years.

SECTION 6. This Ordinance shall go into effect immediately upon its final passage.
