

ORDINANCE NUMBER 2
RIOUS AND DISORDERLY PERSONS

AN ORDINANCE, To apprehend, fine or commit all persons found guilty of committing a breach of the peace, or engaged in any riotous or disorderly conduct tending to a breach of the peace or engaged in the commission of any unlawful act tending to imperil the personal security, or to endanger the property of the citizens, in the Borough of Donora, Washington County, Pennsylvania.

SECTION 1. Be it ordained and enacted by the Borough of Donora, Washington County, Pennsylvania, in Council assembled and it is hereby ordained and enacted by the authority of the same that any person or persons within the Borough of Donora, Washington Pennsylvania, who shall be found guilty of any indecent and improper conduct tending to debauch the public morals and violate common and public decency, or who shall demean himself or themselves in such a disorderly loud and boisterous manner so as to disturb peace and good order of the borough or shall be engaged in quarrelling, fighting or doing any other act or acts whereby the peace and good order of the borough is disturbed or who shall be engaged in the commission of any unlawful act tending to imperil the personal security or endanger the property of the citizens in said borough of Donora, shall be fined not less than Two Dollars nor more than One Hundred Dollars together with all costs of suit and in default of payment of fine or penalty imposed, the defendant may be sentenced and committed to the borough lock-up for a period not exceeding Thirty Days.
