## ORDINANCE NUMBER 68 WEST COLUMBIA ANNEX

AN ORDINANCE declaring the admission of a section of Carroll township to the Borough of Donora.

whereas, a petition has been presented to the burgess and Town Council of the Borough of Donora, praying for the admission to said borough of a section adjacent thereto situate in Carroll township, hereinafter described by metes and bounds, and

whereas, it has been satisfactorily made to appear to the said burgess and Town Council that the said petition has been signed by a majority of the freehold owners of lots, outlots and other tracts of land situate within the limits of said section: now therefore.

Section 1. Be it enacted by the Town Council of the Borough of Donora, in the Council of the Borough of Donora, in the county of Washington and commonwealth of Pennsylvania, and it is hereby enacted by authority of the same, that the lots, outlots and other tracts of land adjacent to the said borough, situate in Carroll township and within the boundaries following, to wit: Beginning at the low water mark of the Monongahela River at the southeast corner of the borough of Donora; thence along line between said borough and line of plan of Columbia (sometimes called "West Columbia") north forty-eight degrees (48 degrees) west four hundred and eighteen (418) feet to a point; thence still along line between said borough and said plan of Columbia, north seventy-one degrees and twenty-five and one-half minutes (71 degrees 252 minutes) west five hundred and sixty-six (566) feet to the east right of way of the Pittsburg, Virginia & Charleston railroad; thence in a southerly direction along said east right of way line of the Pittsburg, Virginia & Charleston railroad; thence in a southerly direction along said east right of way of said railroad, by the plan of Columbia and by the lands of the Union Steel company, formerly George W. Allen, a distance of three thousand four hundred and fifty (3,450) feet to a line between lands formerly of George W. Allen and lands formerly of the Monongahela River Consolidated Coal & Coke company; thence along line between last mentioned lands south four degrees twenty-two minutes (4 degrees 22 minutes ) west seven hundred forty-seven and eight-tenths (747.8) feet to low water mark of the Monongahela river; thence down the Monongahela river along the low water mark of the same by its various courses and distances, a distance of four thousand four hundred and twenty-four (4,424) feet, more or less, to the place of beginning:-

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be, and the same are hereby declared to be admitted to the said borough, and that the section within said boundaries shall forever be deemed and taken and allowed to be a part of said borough, and subject to the jurisdiection and government of the municipal authorities thereof, as fully as if the same had been originally a part of the said borough, agreeably to the provisions of the Act of Assembly in such cases made and provided.
