

ORDINANCE NO. 937

AN ORDINANCE PROHIBITING OUTDOOR FIRES WITHIN THE BOROUGH OF DONORA AND PRESCRIBING PENALTIES FOR THE VIOLATION THEREOF.

BE IT ORDAINED AND ENACTED, by the Council of the Borough of Donora, in regular meeting assembled and it is hereby ordained and enacted by virtue of the power in them vested to promote the general safety, convenience and comfort of the Borough, as follows, to wit:

Section I. No person or persons, either directly or indirectly, or by their agent, shall set or maintain any outdoor fire upon any private property, streets, sidewalks, alleys, or public grounds in the Borough of Donora, or burn or cause to be burned out door, any paper, boxes, rubbish, leaves, or other material or substances of any kind at any hour of the day or night.

Section II. Any person or persons who shall violate the provisions of this Ordinance shall, upon conviction thereof, be sentenced to pay a fine of not more than Twenty-five (\$25.00) Dollars and cost of prosecution, and, in default of payment of such fine cost to imprisonment for not more than ten (10) days.
