

ORDINANCE NO. 982

An Ordinance regulating the numbering of buildings in newly annexed and newly developed areas in the Borough of Donora and in areas not included in any official plan of house numbering heretofore adopted.

The Borough of Donora hereby ordains as follows:

Section 1. The word "building", as used in this ordinance, shall mean any structure used or intended to be used as a dwelling or for business or industry, but shall not include any public building or any structure built as a place of worship, or any accessory building located upon a lot where there is also a main building.

Section 2. In all portions of the Borough of Donora either: (a) not included in any "Official Plan of House Numbering" heretofore adopted and now in effect; (b) hereafter developed by the opening or extension of streets, the subdividing of the land and/or the construction of buildings; or (c) hereafter annexed to the Borough - numbers shall be assigned to all buildings by the Street Commissioner.

Section 3. In assigning numbers to buildings, as required by this ordinance, the Street Commissioner shall observe the following regulations:

(a) Even numbers shall be assigned to buildings on the east and north sides of a street or alley, odd numbers to buildings on the west and south sides.

(b) Upon all streets and alleys running north and south, the numbering system shall commence at First Street, with the number "100", and shall extend northwardly and southwardly from First Street.

(c) Upon all streets and alleys running east and west, the numbering system shall commence at the Pennsylvania Railroad, with the number "100".

(d) One hundred numbers shall be reserved for each full square, which shall constitute the distance on any street or alley between two consecutive intersecting streets, and, regardless of whether the entire one hundred numbers shall be required on any square, the numbering of buildings on the following square shall commence with the following hundred.

(e) The allotment of numbers shall be made, as nearly as practicable, one number for every twenty (20) feet.

(f) Upon all streets and alleys not running in a generally north-south or east-west direction, or in any way not conforming to the prevalent pattern of street arrangements in the Borough, numbers shall be assigned by the Street Commissioner at approximately twenty (20) foot intervals, as closely as possible to the numbers used upon neighboring streets running in an approximately parallel direction, or, if the latter is not practicable, in the manner that the Street Commissioner considers will provide a most logical means of locating the property.
