

ORDINANCE 1248

AN ORDINANCE OF THE BOROUGH OF DONORA FOR THE
ERECTION OF TRAFFIC CONTROL DEVICES COMMONLY KNOWN AS
STOP SIGNS AT ST. NICHOLAS DRIVE EXTENSION

BE IT ORDAINED AND ENACTED by the Council of the Borough of Donora
as follows:

1. That Traffic Control Devices commonly known as Stop Signs shall be placed at St. Nicholas Drive Extension on the intersecting of Weaver Avenue and Orchard Avenue in both easterly and westerly directions.

2. That this Ordinance is being promulgated pursuant to Section 6109 of the Pennsylvania Motor Vehicle Code and after traffic investigation, a copy of which is attached hereto and made a part hereof.

3. All persons violating the terms of this Ordinance shall be subject to prosecution and penalties as enumerated in applicable sections of the Pennsylvania Motor Vehicle Code.

Dear Mr. Kostolansky;

In the month of May, 1989, I was asked by the Boro Council to conduct a traffic study of St. Nicholas Drive to determine a possible solution to vehicles traveling at a high rate of speed. While conducting the study, I spent a total of 16 evenings monitoring traffic between the hours of 6:00 p.m. and 8:00 p.m.. There was an average of 40 to 50 vehicles traveling on St. Nicholas Drive between 5th Ave. and 1st Ave, with every 3rd vehicle traveling at a high rate of speed. I also observed an extra amount of traffic since St. Nicholas Drive was newly paved.

It is my opinion that if stop signs were to be placed on St. Nicholas Drive at the intersections of Weaver Ave. and Orchard Ave., (in both directions, that being east and west), a vehicle would have to come to a complete stop, therefore causing the speed of the traffic flow to decrease greatly.
