

ORDINANCE NO. 1312

AN ORDINANCE AMENDING ORDINANCE NO. 1289 AND ORDINANCE NO. 1305 OF THE BOROUGH OF DONORA, WASHINGTON COUNTY, COMMONWEALTH OF PENNSYLVANIA, REGARDING THE MAKING OF OPENINGS AND EXCAVATIONS IN STREETS, ALLEYS AND WAYS IN THE BOROUGH OF DONORA AND THE PROTECTION, REFILLING, RESURFACING AND REPAVING OF THE SAME AND PROVIDING PENALTIES FOR VIOLATION THEREOF.

BE IT ENACTED AND ORDAINED by the Council of the Borough of Donora, Washington County, Pennsylvania; and it is hereby ordained and enacted by the authority of the same, that SECTION V of Borough of Donora Ordinance No. 1289 regarding the making of openings and excavations in streets, alleys and ways in the Borough of Donora and the protection, refilling, resurfacing and repaving of the same and providing penalties for violation thereof be amended to read as follows:

SECTION V

After securing a permit from the Borough Code Enforcement Officer, the applicant shall present the permit to the Borough Secretary and pay a fee as follows:


- (1) For a permit for a house connection, where the opening is in and improved or unimproved street, Two Hundred Fifty Dollars (\$250.00) for a 5' x 5' opening;

- (2) For a permit for the laying of pipes, mains, or conduits, either by tunnel or excavation, Three Dollars (\$3.00) for each lineal foot up to one hundred lineal feet, then One Dollar (\$1.00) for each lineal foot or fraction thereof, in addition to the required permit fee of Two Hundred Fifty Dollars (\$250.00);
- (3) For a permit for the drilling of any hole on any street or sidewalk for any purpose, Two Hundred Fifty Dollars (\$250.00).

All other provisions of Ordinance Number 1289 and Ordinance No. 1305 not inconsistent with the terms and conditions set forth in this amending Ordinance shall remain in full force and effect.


