

ORDINANCE NUMBER 153

UNION STEEL COMPANY FOR ELECTRIC LINE

AN ORDINANCE giving the consent of the Council of the Borough of Donora, unto the Union Steel Company, its successors, lessees and assigns, to construct and maintain a private line of poles on certain streets in said borough, for the purpose of distributing thereby a system of electric lighting and telephone and telegraph service to their own properties.

BE IT ORDAINED AND ENACTED by the Council of the Borough of Donora, Washington County, Pennsylvania, and it is hereby ordained and enacted by the authority of the same:

SECTION I. That the consent of the said Council is hereby given unto the said Union Steel Company, its successors, lessees and assigns, to construct and maintain a private line of poles on the following streets and avenues in said borough to wit: Along Second Street in West Columbia Plan of the said borough, between the Open Hearth Plant and the Blast Furnaces of said company; along Market Street, in said plan of West Columbia, between Third Street and the Monongahela River; Along Thirteenth Street, in the general plan of said borough, from the Right of Way of the P. V. & C. Railroad Company to Meldon Avenue; thence along Meldon Avenue to the North property line of the Carnegie Land Company, and along McKean Avenue from Thirteenth Street, Northwardly, to said property line along the property of the said Union Steel Company, for the purpose of distributing thereby a system of electric lighting and telephone and telegraph service to its own properties.

SECTION 2. All poles of said system shall be first class in every respect none of which poles shall be less than 25 feet in height. All poles shall be located under the direction of the Committee on highway and sewers, and shall be so located as to least interfere with the customary use of the said streets and avenues, and over the curb line as nearly as practicable.

SECTION 3. The said company, its successors, lessees and assigns shall save and keep harmless the said Borough of Donora, from any and all actions for damages sustained to either persons or property, by reason of the construction, maintenance or operation of said system.

SECTION 4. The said council hereby reserves the right to ordain and enact such other reasonable regulation in the maintenance of said system as may be deemed necessary and proper.
