

ORDINANCE NUMBER 326

PROVIDING FOR THE OPENING OF JOHNSTON ALLEY

AN ORDINANCE providing for the opening of Johnston Alley, in the Borough of Donora, and dedicating the same to public use.

WHEREAS, Nelson B. Johnston has conveyed to the Borough of Donora, Washington County, Pennsylvania, for public street or alley purposes, a strip of ground Ten (10) feet wide, extending from First Street to Second Street, between Kenric Avenue and Allen Avenue, and

WHEREAS, the Burgess and Council of said Borough deem it necessary to open said alley and to accept the same for public use, now therefore,

BE IT ORDAINED AND ENACTED by the Burgess and Town Council of the said Borough of Donora, and it is hereby ordained and enacted by the authority of the same;

SECTION 1.

That a Ten (10) feet wide alley, to be known and designated as Johnston Alley, extending from First Street to Second Street, and being the western part of Lots Nos. 20 and 3, in Block No. 21, of the Plan of said Borough of Donora, be and the same hereby is opened, located and dedicated to public use, and accepted as a part of the General Plan and system of public thoroughfares in said Borough.

SECTION 2.

The Chief Burgess of said Borough and the other proper officers thereof are hereby directed to open and locate said alley as herein provided and the Borough Engineer is directed to enter and designate said alley on the General Plan of streets and alleys of said Borough.
